## WELCOME TO SKYLAKE P.O.A.

We are happy you are visiting Skylake POA where Nature, Mountains and the Warmth of Friends are part of who we are. To make your visit more enjoyable there are a few things we would like to share with you:

**Please keep your guest tag** on the rearview mirror of your vehicle while in Skylake and return it when you leave. Please approach gate at 5 mph at all times.

**Please feel free to walk** any one of our **14 miles** of trails during your visit. Watch for birds, deer, squirrels and maybe a black bear...also snakes. Carrying a walking stick is a good idea. Note the view from our Lookout Tower on Grimes Nose, our highest peak.

**Don't miss the beautiful York Falls** at the end of Falling Creek Road off of Sautee Trail. This is a great place for pictures with picnic tables and a place to cook out. Check it out first to be sure it will accommodate what you want.

**Enjoy the lake while fishing and the swimming pool** while **accompanied** by a resident of Skylake. This is part of our risk management and we want you to be safe at all times. The resident is your permit, so make sure the resident is present when you enjoy the amenities.

**Enjoy walking your dog**, if you brought one, and feel free to use the **Dog Park** near the Post Office area. All pets must be kept on a leash while walking and remember to pick up behind your dog and deposit in the dumpster.

**Driving the 15 plus miles** in Skylake requires a map so remember to pick one up when you enter the gate. Due to the many sharp curves, steep hills, narrow roads, walking residents and construction sites 25 MPH is the maximum speed. Sautee Trail looks like an interstate compared to most roads here, because of the traffic, but the speed is still 25 MPH.

**Please help us deposit all trash** in the dumpsters across from the Postal Area and lock them back. Black bears have been known to frequent that area when they are left unlocked. Yes, they do!

**For your safety please do not enter the pastures and barn areas.** A horse owner must be present for anyone, **including guests or residents**, to enter the barn or pastures. Please help us keep the horses healthy by not feeding them.
